INITIAL STEPS TO SETTLE AN ESTATE

This checklist is intended to outline a number of basic steps you can take prior to meeting with an attorney. This checklist is not exhaustive and should not be substituted for proper legal advice from a experienced probate attorney.

1	Funeral Arrangements. Make funeral arrangements; request certified death certificates from funeral provider.	Time Selectronic Data. Take possession of all electronic devices: computers, cellphones, tablets, etc.
2	Estate Planning Documents. Locate the will, codicils, financial POA and any trust documents.	Employment Benefits. Contact decedent's employer regarding unpair wages and potential death benefits.
3	Ownership Documentation. Find deeds, titles, account statements, and an asset list (i.e. real estate, cars, etc.)	Pay On Death Assets. Beneficiaries of "POD" or "TOD" acts can immediately claim.
4	Social Security. Notify Social Security Administration and investigate survivor's benefits.	10 Credit Cards. Notify credit bureaus; do not pay credit card bills without consulting your estate attorney.
5	Keys. Locate keys for home, automobiles, safe deposit boxes and post office boxes.	11 Cancellations. Cancel subscriptions and request appropriate refunds, cancel recurring charges.
6	Home and Contents. Secure home and all contents; change locks and arrange for someone to safeguard home during funeral, if necessary.	12 Insurance Benefits. Explore benefits including life insurance, accidental death & credit life policies.
